Preface

The Pastoral Provision for Anglicans in the Catholic Church, dating from June 1980, provides for a common identity for former Episcopalian clergy and laypeople who have asked for reconciliation and full communion with the Catholic Church.

In July of 1980 the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith issued an *Accord for Sacraments and Divine Worship for Catholics of the Anglican Tradition*. *The Book of Divine Worship*, yet to be published, sets forth the liturgy for such congregations. Fundamentally, it consists of portions of the 1979 *Book of Common Prayer* adapted for use in the Catholic Church. This book draws on proposals for that document. It is intended for interim use until *The Book of Divine Worship* is finally published.

This book includes only those portions of the liturgy of The Holy Eucharist (Rite One) which are necessary for the faithful in the pews; it is not the full text of the liturgy.
